





MEMORANDUM FOR Assistant Secretary of the Army (Manpower and Reserve Affairs)

SUBJECT: Delegation of Authority for Department of Defense Executive Agent Responsibilities for the Armed Forces Health Surveillance Center

1. Reference Department of Defense (DoD) Directive 5101.1 (DoD Executive Agent), dated 3 Sep 02.
2. Pursuant to the authority delegated to me in paragraph 4.3 of the referenced directive, I hereby delegate to you the authority to act on my behalf for any and all DoD Executive Agent responsibilities, functions and authorities the Secretary of Defense assigned to me in DoD Directive 6490.02E (Comprehensive Health Surveillance), incorporating Change 1, dated 24 Aug 09.
3. You may further delegate this authority to The Surgeon General. Should you choose to do so, you may further restrict or condition the delegation. A redelegation of authority shall not be effective unless it is in writing, signed by you, and has been determined to be legally sufficient upon review by the Office of the Army General Counsel. No redelegation shall take effect until a record copy of the redelegation has been provided to the Office of the Administrative Assistant to the Secretary of the Army, my focal point for DoD Executive Agent matters, for archiving. I will hold you responsible for any and all actions taken pursuant to this delegation or any redelegation thereof.
4. Although not a limitation on your authority to act on my behalf, in those cases where your proposed decision represents a change in precedent or policy; is of significant White House, congressional, DoD or public interest; or has been, or should be, of interest or concern to me for any reason, you will brief me before the decision unless the exigencies of the situation prevent such action. Continue my practice of coordination with the Office of the Army General Counsel.
5. This delegation is effective immediately and expires 3 years from the date of this memorandum, unless earlier canceled, modified or withdrawn.
